Spousal Support Trade-Off in 2014

This screen allows you to optimize the allocation between spousal support and child support for taxes.

You specify a minimum child support amount (which can be zero). You also specify the total combined payment (spousal support + child support).

We will show combined Net Income After Expenses and Taxes, and also combined tax, for ten allocations in the specified rang

The optimum allocation is that which maximizes combined total income -- and minimizes combined tax.

Notes:

- 1. This calculation looks at 2014, only.
- 2. This calculation will work only if the filing status in 2014 is not "joint."
- 3. This calculation assumes a full 12 months of both spousal support and child support.
